NORTH STAINLEY STW

CLIENT: YORKSHIRE WATER
SYSTEM: BIRA



Part of Yorkshire Waters AMP 5 Framework saw the construction of this circular tank - 2.5 metres high. Achieved with a 2 metre panel and 500mm extension piece allowed the customer to keep costs to a minimum whilst achieving an F4 Architects finish, thanks to BIRA's steel face.

TESCO BLAKELY

These 6 metre high walls demanded a high quality finish. The original plan was to line the panels, but thanks to Adapts quality the customer was allowed to use the panels as they were, and the client approved the job with a 100 rating, the highest rating given to any contractor for quality of work.

SCOTSWOOD ROAD

A high class finish was expected for these 7.1 metre high walls in Newcastle Upon Tyne, located next to the River Tyne. Strict protocol was in place, and vigorous design checks were carried out and approved by the customer before construction. Ormas safety features allowed the contractor to meet all requirements with ease.

THE LODGE

FORMWORK SYSTEM: BIRA



With difficult site conditions and minimal space to construct these complex shaped stariwells, at 6 metres high, the combination of the BIRA lightweight steel forms and Orma was the only option for the customer. The request was late, and with only 2 days turnaround Adapt managed to pull off the solution with the customers input. The combination of panels, hinged corners, fixed/adjustable and compensation clamps saw all the different components allow for one simple full height pour.
